Container Hire Charges Import and Export policy

Dear Valued Customers

After a recent review of our container hire charge policy, Pacific Forum Line (PFL) wishes to advise our customers of a revision and implementation of both import and export effective 1st January 2024 as follows;

- PFL allow clients 14 free days to pack a container for export or to unpack an import container.
- For export cargo, time starts on the date the equipment is released to the shipper.
- For import cargo, time starts on the date the equipment is available for delivery after discharge.
- Container hire charges apply when equipment exceeds the free period (i.e. 14 days).
- Once free period has expired container hire charges will apply in accordance with below (or local currency equivalent)
